



LIVING IN ANOTHER EUROPEAN COUNTRY WHILE YOUR ASYLUM CLAIM IS EXAMINED THERE (RELOCATION)



Relocation is a legal and safe way for you to move from Greece to another European country as an asylum seeker.

You can ask for relocation if you meet all four conditions:

1. You have asked for asylum in Greece.
2. You were registered and fingerprinted in Greece.
3. You are a national of Syria, Iraq, Central African Republic, Eritrea, Burundi, Costa Rica, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Bahrain, Maldives and British Overseas Countries and Territories. You can also apply if you are a stateless person (person without a nationality) who lived in these countries. This list of nationalities will be updated in July. At this time it is not clear, if some nationalities will be added or removed from this list.
4. You entered Greece after 16 September 2015.

Even if you meet all four conditions, there is no guarantee that you will be transferred to another country.

You cannot choose the country where you will be relocated to. However, you should tell the asylum authorities if you have language skills, family links or other reasons why it would be better for you to live in a specific country.

Pre-registration is the first step for relocation!
